Cathedral

Ordinations to the priesthood will take place at the Cathedral on Saturday, June 3. Two young men from the Cathedral parish, Rev. Chas. Shay and Rev. Victor Hurley, will be elevated to this dignity, and will celebrate their first holy mass on the following day, Trinity Sunday, at 9.30 o'clock and 10.45 o'clock, respectively.

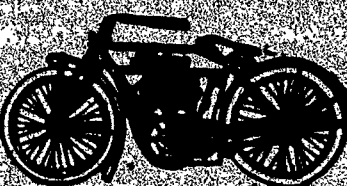

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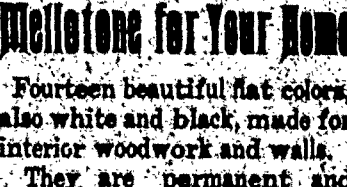
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
