The annual banquet of the Alumni Association will be held at the Pinnacle Club House on Tuesday evening next.

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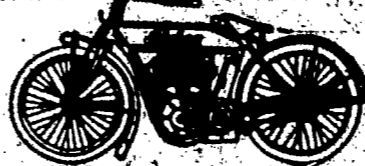
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
