### Proof Positive

When they think they are losing votes or influence in a given locality by the impression that they are opposed to either the Catholic Church or any other church, the Socialists set up a howl that their cult is in no sense opposed to or connected with religion, that it is simply and solely a political and economic policy.

Just as a sort of counter-irritant let us reprint from the Toronto Globe of September 21st, 1910, a letter to its editor from Moses Baritz, official organizer for the Socialist party in Canada. To the Editor of the "Globe,"

Would you permit me as the accredited organizer for the Socialist party of Canada for the Province of Ontario to give a repudiation to the statements of the Rev. Dr. Chown that "Socialism is founded upon the teachings of Jesus." The Socialist position is founded upon science, both sociological and economic.

As such it is opposed to all religions, which we maintain were products of given social conditions.

With the establishment of a Social regime, Christianity, Judaism and all supernatural ideas clinging to mankind will be abolished.

The Socialist party of Canada is opposed to the unscientific worship of Christ, Buddha or Mahomet.

We do not believe in the salvation of the Church. We oppose that idea. It is far better to have the people to understand this now than let the confusion exist or let it be disseminated in the pulpit.

Socialists cannot believe in any supernatural God. If they do they are not Socialists.

The pamphlet issued by the Socialist party of Great Britain on "Socialism and Religion" is the only attitude we can take up.

The Church will find in us their unrelenting foes. Christianity with its superstitions must be submerged before the workers obtain their complete emancipation. That is our slogan. That is our challenge.

Far better let it be known now and so avoid misconception in the future.

Finally a Christian cannot be a Socialist and a Socialist cannot be a believer in Christ or God.

Not With Them At All

It seems that some one misrepresented Rabbi Silverman's sympathy with the membership in the "Guardians of Liberty." His Eminence, Cardinal Gibbons has requested the Catholic press of the United States to give publicity to the following letter received by him from the Rabbi: "I am in no way affiliated with the Guardians of Liberty, and am not responsible for any of its acts and have no sympathy with the campaign it is waging. If you think well of it, I trust you will instruct your secretary to communicate the contents of this

letter to the Catholic press in order to correct any false report that may have been spread. As far as I know, no Jew is associated with the Guardians of Liberty."

### They Should Vote

In California the suffrage question is on a different plane from New York state. Here the question is whether women should be given the ballot, in California the women already have the ballot and the question is should they exercise it. Archbishop Riordan is of the opinion that it is the duty of Catholic women to exercise the suffrage and he said so in the following letter read to all the Catholic churches in San Francisco the other Sunday:—

Rev. and dear Father: While our Catholic people, with the high ideals which the Church holds before them, ought to be models of right living and exemplars of the highest Christian virtue, they should also possess a high degree of civic virtue.

The enjoyment of the privileges and blessings of citizenship impose correlative duties and obligations which no citizen should ignore. Among these duties the chiefest is voting. Especially is this true in a country with our form of government, in which a vote has but an arithmetical value. Majorities rule, both in making the laws and in choosing our officials; hence it is clear that the stability of our government depends ultimately upon the civic and moral virtues of its individual citizens.

Our Catholic people, therefore, should be not only law-abiding citizens, but should take part in the making of the laws under which they live and in the election of officers worthy to administer the laws when made. This is true for women as well as for men.

In California woman's suffrage is now an accomplished fact. Women ought not, therefore, to permit their traditional love for the virtues of the home, their innate dignity and becoming reserve to prevent them from discharging the chiefest of civic obligations. I wish, therefore, you would take a seasonable opportunity of advising our new electors to register that they may be at all times prepared to give their services in making California's a model State and of handing down to the children that come after them a tradition of righteousness and of unselfish patriotism.
