Turn on the Calcium. The doorman of the Vanity's house rang at about 8 o'clock one night, and Mrs. Vanity said excitedly to her husband.

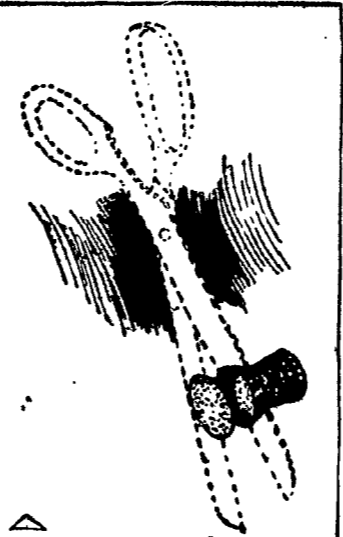
Not Biblical. A Sunday school teacher was reviewing her young class on Bible verses they had recently learned.

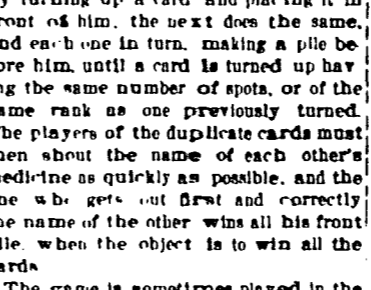
Blind Man's Buff With Spoons. Variation of blind man's bluff may be played in this fashion.

Lacks One Essential. Arnold Bennett, the novelist of the English potteries, said one day to a New York interviewer.

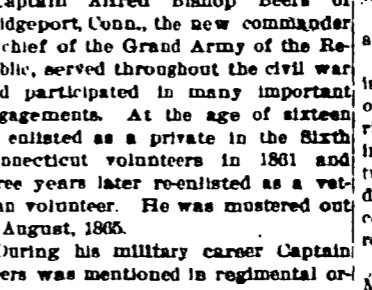
SNAPSHOTS AT CELEBRITIES
