The reception was attended by several hundred former students of the academy, many of whom came to say a sad farewell to their personal friend and confessor.

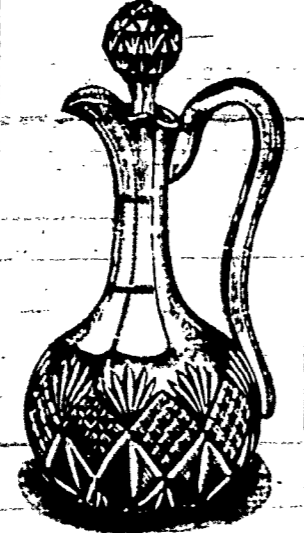

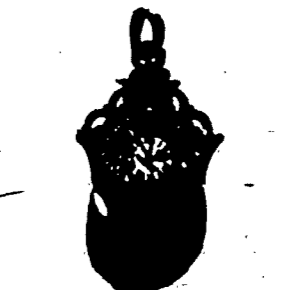
