An illiterate in the eyes of the United States census bureau is a person of ten years or over who cannot write regardless of his or her ability to read. Judged by this standard, illiteracy in this country has decreased in the last decade from 10.7 to 7.5 per cent. Among children from ten to fourteen years old only a fraction above four to the hundred are now illiterate.

There are 435 colleges and universities listed by the United States bureau of education in the current Educational Directory. Ohio and Pennsylvania have each 42 institutions of college rank and New York and Illinois 33. Missouri has 28, Iowa and Tennessee 27, Virginia 25, North Carolina 22, Indiana and Kentucky 21, Georgia 19, Kansas, 19 and Massachusetts 18.

The city of Greater New York has an area of 209,218 acres. Manhattan has an area of 14,038 acres. A trifle less than three-quarters of all the workers in New York city are employed in Manhattan. About one-half of all the workers in New York city are employed below Fourteenth street in Manhattan, which constitutes about 1 per cent of the total area of Greater New York.
