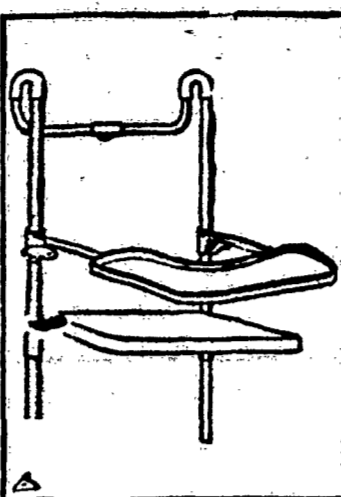

HINTS FOR THE BUSY HOUSEWIFE

Nursery Chair That May Be Raised and Lowered.

This framework can then be hooked over a chair back or the back of a settee or some other piece of furniture, and it is at once transformed into a perfectly safe and comfortable chair for baby.

Scalloped Apples. One-fourth cupful of sugar, one salt spoonful of cinnamon, one-quarter of a lemon rind, grated, one-quarter cupful of butter, one cupful of soft bread crumbs, three cupfuls of sliced apples.

Mix the sugar, cinnamon and lemon rind. Melt the butter and stir it into the crumbs. Butter deep dish, put in one-quarter of the crumbs, one-half of the apples and sprinkle with half of the sugar.

Veal Cutlets. Have them cut as handsomely as possible, since what appeals to the eye enhances the pleasure of the palate and thus aids digestion.

Lentil Soup. Half cupful of dry lentils, three and one-half cupfuls of stock or water, two small onions, one to one and one-quarter teaspoonfuls of salt, one and one-half cupfuls of milk will be needed.
