Next Sunday will be communion day for members of the Rosary Society.

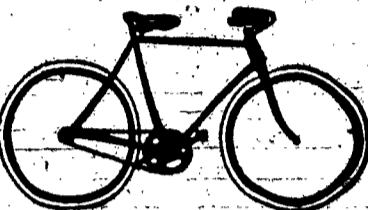
