Starch For Laces and Muslins. Mix a small quantity of corn flour smoothly with cold water. This will be found excellent for highly stiffening all delicate and lacy fabrics.

Steak With Bananas. Broil a sirloin steak, place on a hot platter, spread both sides with a tablespoonful of melted butter mixed with one teaspoonful of salt and one-fourth as much white pepper.

Cookery Points.

When Raspberries Are Ripe. For breakfast raspberries can be served cold and fresh, with cream, or they can be daintily served in glass dishes with a little sirup poured over them.

Raspberries can also be prepared in this way for luncheon and can be given a more piquant flavor if stemmed currants, half as many as there are berries, are added to them.

A hearty raspberry pudding, which is wholesome enough for children, is made thus: Thicken a quart of hot milk with a tablespoonful of flour rubbed smooth in a few tablespoonfuls of cold milk.

Raspberry Dumplings. Raspberry dumplings that are light and delicate are made in this way: Boil a cupful of water with two tablespoonfuls of butter and add a cupful of sifted flour.

Delicious raspberry tarts can be made by cooking paste in patty tins, filling the shells with rice or beans in waxed paper to keep the paste from bubbling and filling the shells with fresh raspberries covered with sugar and whipped cream.

Raspberry Pudding. A delicious raspberry pudding is made in individual portions. Have ready well-buttered individual pudding or custard cups.

Raspberry Bavarian Cream. Raspberry Bavarian cream is a hot day dessert which does not require freezing. To make it soak half a package of gelatin for two hours in half a cupful of cold water.

Pineapple Sponge. Soak one-half package of gelatin in one-half cupful of cold water, dissolve over steam, add one cupful of grated pineapple and the juice of half a small lemon and sweeten to taste.
