The closing exercises by the pupils of our school, will take place at the parish hall, Sunday evening, June 22. Also a matinee at 2.30 p. m.

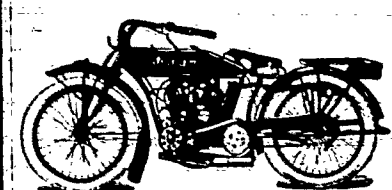
St. Bridget's.

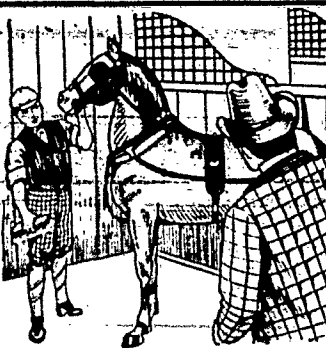
