It is a sad commentary on the tendency of the age and so far we have traveled from the teaching of our fathers that such an organization should ever be thought necessary.

Real Peace An esteemed contemporary, in our opinion, scores a point when it urges that if we would have peace with England, why not with all countries. Our contemporary goes on -

If it is to be peace, why not make it universal? Why single out the English-speaking nations? At a meeting of the executive committee of the peace committee in this city the other day John J. Hynes expressed the thought that this country should also celebrate its centenary of peace with other nations besides Great Britain. By all means, let arrangements for the peace celebration proceed but let them be sufficiently broad to include all friendly powers.
