Stuffy McInnis, Athletics' Great First Baseman.

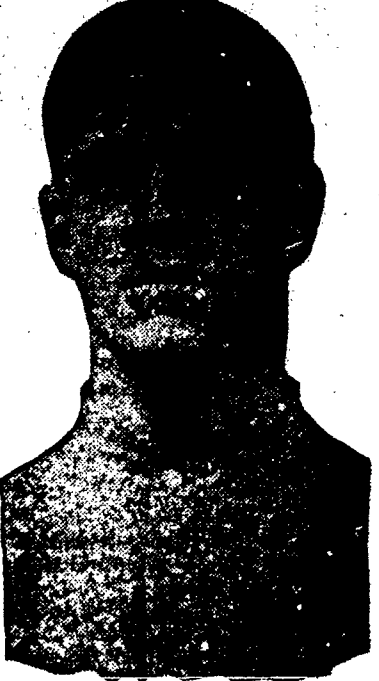
