
**St. John the Evangelist**

## Home For Catholic Girls

The building that has been occupied by the Pinnacle Club at Monroe Avenue and Field St., has been acquired by the site committee of the Catholic Charities Guild, and will be remodeled into a home for homeless Catholic girls. The property acquired has a building frontage of 94 feet and a depth of 48 feet. The building is of three floors and basement, and was built about six years ago. It is modern in every equipment and is finished throughout in hardwood. The purchase also includes a vacant lot in the rear. The committee expects to begin remodeling the building as soon as the transfer of title is made. Estimates show that it will be possible to make forty comfortable and well arranged rooms in it. The purchase price includes the bowling alley and billiard and pool equipment of the club, which will be disposed of by the committee.
