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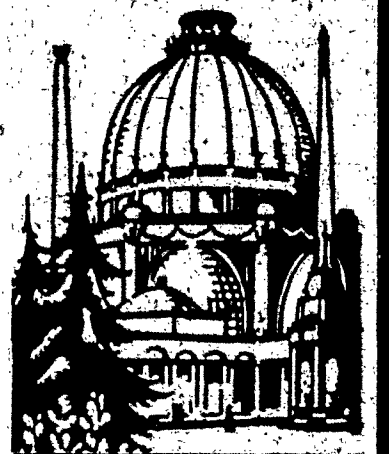
There are fancy mixtures, plaids, checked checks, overchecks, navy serge and poplin suit effects from which to choose.

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
