The Duke of the Abruzzi is no stranger to America. He has been in this country on numerous occasions, and it is said that at one time he was a suitor for the hand of former Miss Katherine Elkins, daughter of former Senator Elkins of West Virginia.

The duke is a cousin of the present king of Italy and is himself the son of a king. His father was elected to the throne of Spain in 1870 and ruled three years, when he resigned his scepter.

The Duke of the Abruzzi was born at Madrid, in 1873, during his father's tenure of the throne of Spain. He was brought up in the Italian navy under the supervision of his uncle, the Duke of Genoa.

Household Hints.

To remove stains from marble, apply a mixture of saleratus and whiting with a damp cloth.

To make a dress that is faded perfectly white, wash in boiling water to which cream of tartar has been added.

A few drops of oil of sassafras will drive red ants away from the pantry.

Wash and pare four large potatoes (cut them into small dice.) Chop one-quarter of a pound of ham and one good sized onion.

Scale and clean the herrings carefully without washing them out of heads and tails and split fish open and take out the backbone.

When washing handkerchiefs break up a quarter of an ounce of orris root and tie it in a piece of muslin, boiling it in with the handkerchiefs for a quarter of an hour.

Dice half a dozen potatoes, crisp in cold water, then drain and boil until tender. Drain the water off, put the potatoes in a baker, season with pepper and salt, stir a tablespoonful of butter through the pieces, pour over them half a cupful of milk, cover the top with grated cheese, bake quickly and serve hot.

A good plan is to use marbles to clean water bottles. Wrapping each in cloth and shaking them in warm soda give a clear, clean and shining bottle.

Protective Coating For Steel.

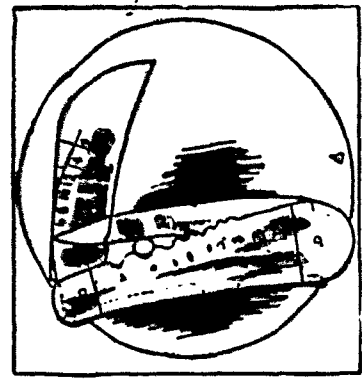
One of the best and simplest methods of producing a protective black coating is of rather recent origin and is known as Coletting, from the name of the discoverer, Coylett.
