The funeral was held Thursday morning from this church.



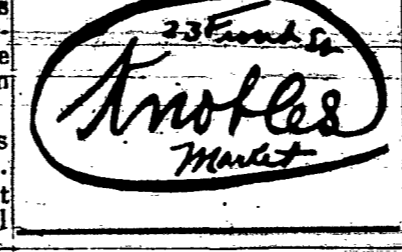
