Representative John I. Burnett of Alabama, chairman of the house committee on immigration, believes in a stringent revision of the immigration laws.

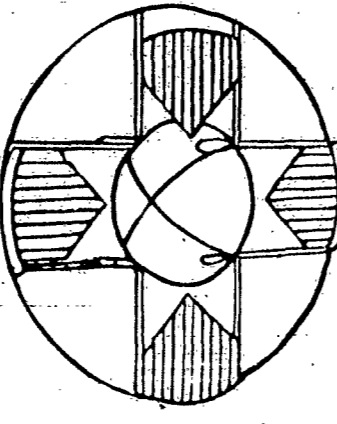
There is no more important matter before congress, said Mr. Burnett, than the restriction of immigration to our shores.

Device For Cutting Grape-fruit and Oranges.
