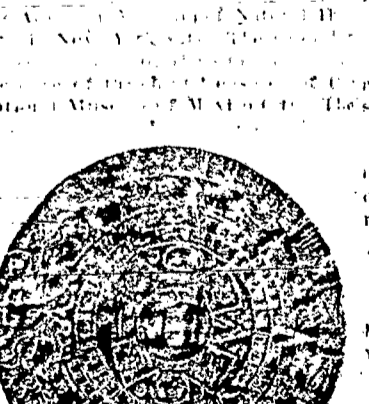
getting his best nobility by cutting capers that require his banishment to Africa. That was his first romance, when he was intent on marrying a pretty girl named Marie Sulzer.
