Blessed Sacrament.

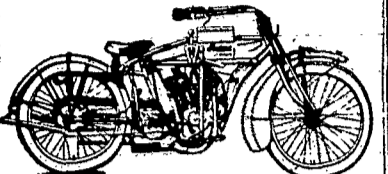

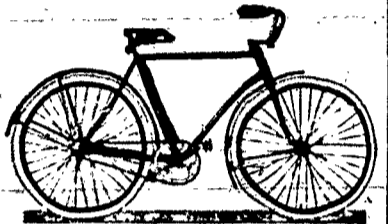
