A months mind requiem mass was read for the repose of the soul of Mrs. Dorothea Frisch at the request of the Rosary Society.

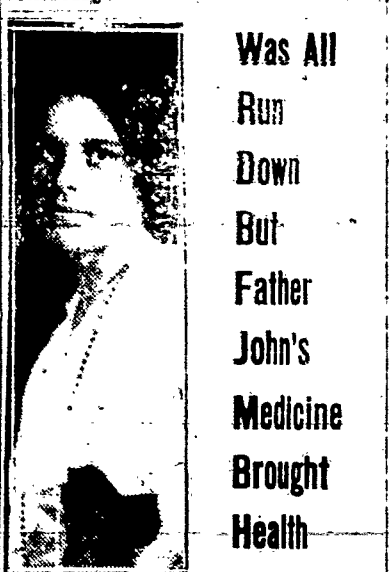

**Ontario Beach Park to Open Saturday.**

On Saturday, May 27th, occurs the formal opening of Ontario Beach Park, Rochester's big playground on the shores of Lake Ontario, and which event will be emphasized on Decoration Day. For the children, Saturday, perhaps, will hold the greater interest, for on that day all the children in Rochester are to be admitted free for an inspection of the park. No longer a suburb of the Flower City, Ontario Beach Park has been, by the annexation act of about a year ago included within the city's limits and the policy outlined by E. H. Vaughan, recently appointed manager of the pleasure place, includes the maintenance of a standard for the recreation grounds that is in keeping with Rochester's reputation for high grade products.

Dedicated to summer happiness over half a century ago, Ontario Beach Park is known throughout the State as the Mecca of those who would forget the sordid, work-a-day cares in a sojourn of rest or revel amid bracing lake breezes.

For Decoration Day Manager Vaughan has secured a list of 34 free outdoor features which, by reason of their novel nature are expected to be a source of real entertainment to those who may make the park their objective point on the coming holiday. Spick and span in readiness for dispensing merriment and cheer will be Hilarity Hall, The Breezer, Canals of Venice, Giant Carousel, Flying Airships, "Watch Your Step," German Village, Dancing Pavilion, Bathing Pavilion, Picnic Grounds, Japanese Garden and other avenues through which pleasure may be successfully sought in varied forms.

By reason of Ontario Beach Park now being a part of the city, the grounds will be under the policing of Rochester's "Finest", which fact, no doubt, will tend toward eliminating all objectionable elements and incidents which might mar the enjoyment of the crowds expected on Decoration Day.
