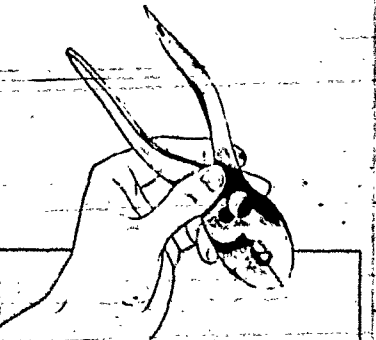
SCIENCE—INDUSTRY.

Kitchen Apron That Fastens Without Strings.

Make a baked custard with a quart of milk, with six eggs and three quarts of a cupful of sugar.

Instead of stopping your work when the sewing machine foot gets loose and taking time then to set it off and fasten it simply slip a few large rubber bands over the small wheel.

A tablespoonful of butter, a level teaspoonful of browned nutmeg and a level teaspoonful of salt.

Set a tomato that shows no signs of turning cross yellow for coloring in the frying process, there is a disagreeable taste.

Grind two cups of cooked egg-lard with pepper, celery salt, one teaspoonful of onion juice.

To remove grease stains from white fabric, rub with a little lemon juice and a little salt.

Do not bake too hot or too long when baking custard or the custard will be some watery.
