Fr. J. Pedebidau, P. F. M., sends us some photographs of the submerged villages of Tonkin, and the scene is a depressing one. The little straw thatched huts are almost covered with water, and the owners may be seen here and there viewing their abandoned property disconsolately from rafts.

The inundation occurred last July, and since then Tonkin has been added to the long list of countries suffering from famine. Indeed, half the world or at least the missionary world is starving at the present time. Tonkin's condition is particularly sad, for not only have the crops destroyed, but also the little homes and all the stores that might have gone to feed the people for a while at least have been swept away.

Every day the fathers, mothers and all the children scatter broadcast in search of food, or rather the substitutes for it. The men go to the distant forests, the women and children scatter over the rice fields and along the riverbanks gathering a species of shellfish which is not only very indigestible, but often brings on serious sickness, resulting in death.
