## Catholic Week In New York.

New York, Aug. 20.—Three princes of the Roman Catholic church, the Apostolic delegate to the United States, the Papal Nuncio to Brazil, scores of bishops and other dignitaries, several hundred priests and thousands of laymen participated here today in the celebration of a solemn pontifical high mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral. The occasion was the formal opening of the fifteenth annual convention of the American Federation of Catholic Societies and the sixty-first annual convention of the National Federation of German Catholics. Seldom in the history of the church has there been so notable a gathering of ecclesiastics outside of Rome.

It was estimated that more than 8,000 persons crowded into the cathedral, while twice as many more congregated in the streets surrounding the great edifice to view the procession which preceded the mass.

At the opening of the ceremonies, Monsignor Michael J. Lavell, after his own and night this year, all of which may be seen free of charge by visitors to the Exposition. The gate admission will be the same as last year, 25 cents for adults and 15 cents for children.

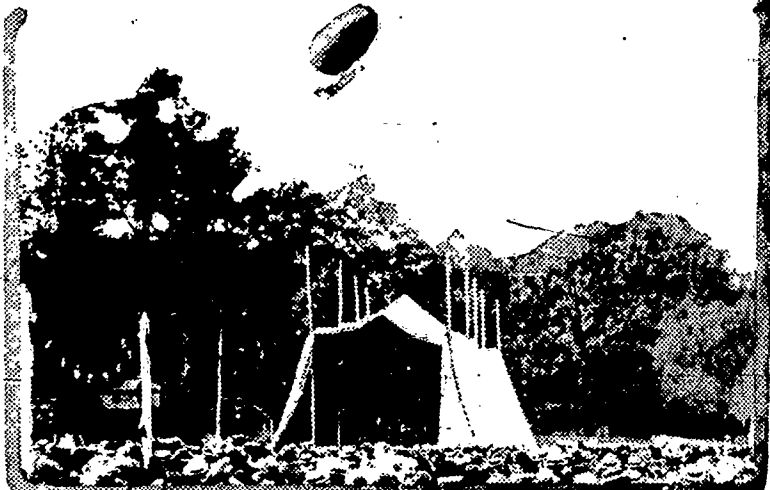
The Holy Father will watch with a loving and paternal eye the convention of Catholic Societies of the United States holding their annual convention in New York. He sends earnest wishes that their friendly discussions shall accomplish much for the welfare and honor of the Catholic name in your favored land. And while hoping for the most consoling results from your concord, activity and wisdom, he grants most heartily the apostolic benediction to the federation and to all who take part in it.

Three temporary canopied thrones were erected within the chancel for Cardinal Gibbons and Archbishop Bonzano, the papal delegate to the United States. Cardinal Farley, who sang mass, occupied the permanent throne within the chapel.

Bishop Thomas F. Hickey, of Rochester, preached the sermon, taking for his text: "For this was I born, and for this came I into the world, that I should give testimony to the truth."

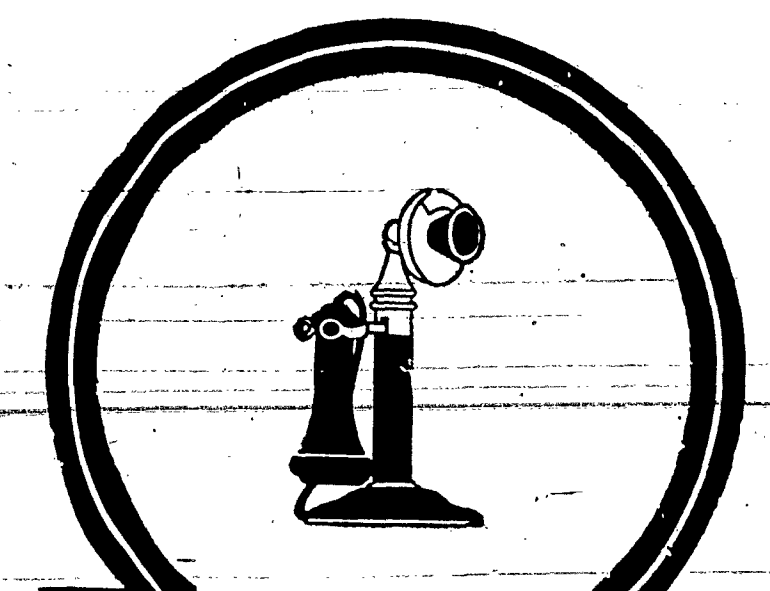
Among the church dignitaries present besides the three cardinals were: Archbishops Aversa, Papal Nuncio to Brazil; Edmond F. Prendergast of Philadelphia, Sebastian Messmer of Milwaukee and Bruchesi of Montreal; Bishops J. F. Regis, Canevin, of Pittsburgh and Denis J. Dougherty of Buffalo.

## Zeppelin Warship and Creator's Band for Rochester Exposition



Among the many free attractions at the Rochester Exposition, which will open for one week on Labor Day, Monday, September 4th, will be a Zeppelin war ship, one of the dreaded war scouts of the air of which all the world is talking. The giant machine is sent here by Leo Stevens, instructor of air ships for the United States Army. The ship will circle, dip and dive and drop bombs loaded with confetti in the Exposition buildings every afternoon about four o'clock.

Among the other free attractions at the Exposition will be Guiseppe Creatore and his world famous band of Italian musicians. Concerts will be given each afternoon and night. There will be several big sensational open-air performances every afternoon and night this year, all of which may be seen free of charge by visitors to the Exposition.
