Will open next Monday evening, September 18. Students wishing to enter for the regular commercial, shorthand or stenotypy courses should begin on the opening night.

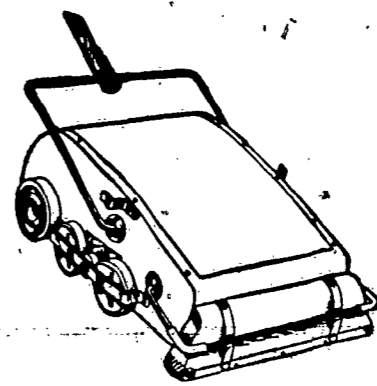
