### Home Cookery

#### Beef Loaf.

Two pounds of round steak, chopped fine, one egg, one cupful of roller crackers, one half cupful of milk, one slice of salt pork, chopped; salt, pepper and sage. Mix well and bake one hour.

#### Creamed Eggs.

Chop five or six hard boiled eggs, not too fine. Put over the fire in a suitable dish, one cupful of milk, one tablespoonful of butter, salt and pepper. When this comes to a boil stir into it a tablespoonful of flour wet with cold milk. When the dressing becomes thick and smooth stir in the chopped eggs. Serve on toast. This makes a fine supper dish.

#### Potato Soup.

Four large potatoes, one onion, three cupfuls of milk, celery salt, one table spoonful of flour, two heaping table spoonfuls of butter and a teaspoonful of chopped parsley if desired. Cook milk with onion in a double boiler, to which add the flour and butter mixed together. Mash potato when cooked add to milk, season with salt and pepper and strain through a fine strainer. Serve very hot.

#### Scrapple.

Clean and cook a pig's head till the meat comes off the bone. Take the bones out, chop meat very fine, season with salt, pepper and herbs. Skim the grease from the liquor the meat was boiled in. Put meat back into liquor and thicken with corn meal and buckwheat flour or middlings. Cook one hour, stir to keep from burning. Pour in a mold. Eat cold sliced or fry.

#### Stuffed Tomatoes.

Select large tomatoes of even size and scoop out a small place in the top and fill with a stuffing made as follows: Chop very fine any kind of cold meat or fowl with a very small piece of bacon, fry an onion, chopped fine in a table spoonful of butter and when nearly done add the meat, some bread crumbs, pepper and salt, cook a minute, mix well, add the yolk of an egg and fill the tomatoes. Place in a baking dish and sprinkle bread crumbs over the top, with small bits of butter on each tomato, and bake.

### HOLLY TREE LEGENDS.

Many legends cluster round the holly or "holly tree," one of the oldest of which is that the plant never grew on earth until Christ came to earth and pressed the soil with his footsteps when it sprang up boldly and flourished and sent forth many spines to protect it from attack. Whenever animals would have harmed the Christ in the fields the holly clustered about and protected him. Even a cursory examination of the holly tree will show you that the leaves growing on the bottom bough are much more protected by prickles than are those near the top of the tree, and even unto this day cattle cannot be induced to approach the beautiful foliage of the holly tree.

## Aftermath of the Christmas Turkey

#### Escaloped Turkey.

Cover the bottom of a baking pan with chopped fowl, season with salt, pepper and two or three teaspoonfuls of gravy. Cover with a thin layer of breadcrumbs and bits of butter, then more meat, etc., until all is used, with crumbs on top. Pour over all a beaten egg mixed with a cupful of milk and bake three fourths of an hour.

#### Turkey With Macaroni and Tomato.

Boil one-fourth pound of macaroni in salted water until tender and drain. Cut in small pieces the remains of cold roasted fowl. Butter a baking dish and put in a layer of macaroni, add a thin layer of soft breadcrumbs, then a layer of meat seasoned with salt, pepper and gravy, then more macaroni, crumbs, etc., until the meat has been used, finishing with crumbs. Pour over all a cupful or more of strained and seasoned tomatoes and bake one-half hour in a brisk oven.

#### Deviled Turkey.

Mix two cupfuls of chopped fowl with one cupful of breadcrumbs. Add three hard boiled eggs pressed through a sieve. Season all with a little parsley, onion juice, salt and pepper to taste. Lastly add a cupful of cream or evaporated milk, mix well, pack in baking cups and bake until brown.

#### Turkey Envelopes.

Mince cold fowl, season and moisten with gravy. Roll paste thin, cut in four inch squares, put a large table spoonful of the meat on each fold, paste over like an envelope, brush with white of egg and bake.

#### Turkey Croquettes.

Mix two cupfuls of chopped turkey with a cupful of cold mashed potatoes, sweet or white, and enough gravy to bind together; season, mixing thoroughly; make into croquettes, dip in beaten eggs and crumbs and fry in deep fat.

#### Turkey and Potato Hash.

In a buttered baking pan put a layer of thinly sliced cold boiled sweet or white potatoes, season with salt and pepper, cover with a thin layer of breadcrumbs, add a layer of chopped meat well seasoned, more potatoes, etc., until you have a sufficient quantity. Over all pour a cupful of thin gravy and bake for three-fourths of an hour and until brown on top.

#### Mincéd Sandwich Ham.

Boil a ham bone until the meat is tender, adding a little vinegar and a few cloves to the water. When cold remove the gristle and chop the meat fine. Mix with one-half cupful of vinegar, two teaspoonfuls of butter, melted and hot, one teaspoonful of mustard mixed with a little water, one level teaspoonful of sugar and season with salt and pepper, and when this dressing is boiling hot add two well beaten eggs, beating them in with an egg beater. When cold add enough cream to thin the ham to a good consistency for spreading.

## Emperor Charles I. New Ruler of Austria-Hungary

Charles I. is the title of the new emperor of Austria and king of Hungary. Before his elevation to the throne he was Archduke Charles Francis Joseph and a grandnephew of the late emperor. He is twenty-nine years

old and at the time of his predecessor's death was in command of the Austrian troops on the Transylvania front.

The new emperor is a nephew of Archduke Francis Ferdinand, who, with his wife, was slain at Sarajevo, Bosnia, on June 28, 1914. This tragedy made Charles Francis Joseph heir apparent to the Austrian throne. Before that time he had been little known outside his own country.

Emperor Charles I was married in 1911 to Princess Zita, daughter of Duke Robert of Parma. She is of Bourbon descent.

Their first child was born Nov. 20, 1912, and was named Francis Joseph Otto. He is now heir apparent to the Austrian throne. The other children of the couple are the Archduchess Adelaide, born Jan. 3, 1914, Archduke Robert Charles Louis, born Feb. 8, 1915, and Archduke Felix Frederick August, born May 31, 1916.

### Being on Time

"Any fellow who can't keep an appointment"—The rest of the sentence was lost, as we moved out of hearing, but this was enough to stir a responsive chord in the heart of any who heard. The concluding statement is easily imagined. The remark was made by a middle aged man to a young boy and was doubtless followed by a forceful word of warning. We hope that it will be effective and that the youth will never again bring forth such a look of annoyance as was shown on the face of the speaker.

Can we blame him? What is more annoying than having hurried to be on time to find the other person late? More often than not there is no excuse for the delay. A few moments here, a few moments there, seem to make no difference, and we walk on. Men who are particular to the last degree in meeting a payment straggle in a few moments late to a mere appointment.

How often we have been disturbed by the late comer at the theater, the church and the concert! Men complain that their wives are slow in dressing, but when a fellow fails to keep an appointment he ordinarily has no one to blame but himself—his own carelessness.

Here, as in all we do, it is the little things that count, that show up the real character of a man. Just remember that the other fellow dislikes waiting as much as you do, and make a desperate effort to "get there" on time. Your reward will be a smile of welcome instead of a scowl of impatience.

Work You Enjoy is Less Tiring.

There is a helpful article in the American Magazine about getting tired and resting up. The writer says: "The practical application of my illustration is this: If you have a job you really like, a job which commands your whole soul, you will work at it with less fatigue than if you are dissatisfied with your lot. This is why the clock watcher, the chap who works only because he must work, is usually more tired at the day's end than the fellow clerk who has a real interest in what he is doing.

"Moreover, if circumstances have forced you into work which is not congenial you will find that efficiency can be added and fatigue staved off if you will let your mind dwell on those features of the work which you like best."

### Punishing a Boy

The best kind of punishment for a boy who has committed a fault is one which exacts moral, not physical, payment. "Doing" something to a child cannot possibly have the same constructive results as, for instance, a fine or the deprivation of a pleasure. Nothing will "get" a boy quicker than to be told quietly to leave his skates on mother's desk for the afternoon or to recall the invitation given his chum for a coveted Saturday afternoon together. There are many little ways to gain the boy by an appeal to his moral rather than his physical self and ways that leave the atmosphere between parent and child unclouded by the wave of hot passion in both which is pretty sure to follow a thrashing.

Has your boy got penny to do? To give a child nothing to do and to expect him to be good is cruel. To play with the children is just as vital and necessary as to study with them or discipline them, and play builds character in parents as well as in children.

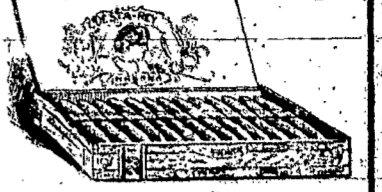
### Good Books.
