To Grow Miscellaneous Plants in the House

THE following suggestions for preparations for the indoor garden and for caring for it later are made by specialists of the United States department of agriculture.

If an indoor window box is decided upon, a good depth for it is about eight inches. The bottom of the box should be covered with stones and broken pottery for drainage.

The indoor window box should be as long as the window is wide, and it should be placed either on brackets, a table or legs permanently fastened to it.

Beginners are about the only plants that may be expected to flower in a window box. For the most part foliage plants must be depended upon.
