War With Germany.

Early Friday morning by a vote of 373 to 50 the House of Representatives passed the resolution declaring that a state of war exists between the United States and Germany. The resolution authorizes and directs the President to employ the military and naval forces and all resources of the nation to bring the war to a successful termination.

A bill has been prepared and will be submitted to Congress to provide for a large army by draft unless enough volunteers enlist. All youths between the ages of 19 and 25 are to be called by selective conscription.

THE LEPEERS HAVE A NEW CHURCH IN AFRICA.

A church at Pretoria, for lepers, was dedicated recently by Right Rev. Dr. Cox, Bishop of the Transvaal. The church is of the Romanesque style and is lighted by twenty-five windows, twenty of which were given by the Trappists of Pinetown, Natal. Other windows were donated by the Monks of Caldey and Mr. Hardman of London. Frank Brangwyn, the distinguished artist, has promised to give the Stations of the Cross, fourteen large paintings. Father de Hovre, O. M. I., composed the music of the Mass, and trained a choir of the lepers.

Few Facts About The Popes.

The whole number of Popes, from St. Peter to Benedict XV., is 260. Of these, 82 are venerated as saints, 33 having been martyred. One hundred and four were Romans, and 103 natives of other parts of Italy; 15 Frenchmen; 9 Greeks; 7 Germans; 5 Asiatics; 3 Africans; 3 Spaniards; 2 Dalmatians; 1 Hebrew; 1 Thracian; 1 Dutchman; 1 Portuguese; 1 Canadian, and 1 Englishman.

Nine Pontiffs have reigned less than 1 month, thirty less than 1 year, and eleven more than 20 years. Only six have occupied the Pontifical chair of Rome over 23 years. These are: St. Peter, who held the Roman See 25 years, 2 months, 7 days; Sylvester I., 23 years, 10 months, 27 days; Hadrian I., 23 years, 10 months, 17 days; Pius VI., 24 years, 8 months, 14 days; Pius VII., 23 years, 5 months, 6 days; Pius IX., who celebrated his 25th year in the Pontifical chair; June 16, 1871.
