

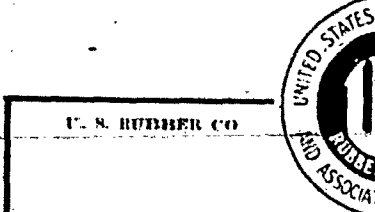

OUR DEPARTMENT OF STATE, Archbishop Hanna Given Royal Reception.

Its Father and First Secretary Was Robert R. Livingston.

Our first secretary for foreign affairs was Robert R. Livingston of New York, a statesman and jurist who ranked high among the giants who ruled the Continental congress and carried the country through the Revolution.

The department in the face of difficulties which would have driven a less courageous man away from his work for in the congress there was a general fear of government and a general disinclination to delegate any governmental powers.

Let the editor of the Diplomatic Correspondence of the American Revolution, Dr. Francis Wharton, describe the father of the state department.

"Livingston," he says, "though a much younger man than Franklin, possessed in his dispassionate and his many-sidedness not a few of Franklin's characteristics."

Grand Knight Shafer introduced Mr. O'Grady, who presided during the remainder of the evening. Mr. O'Grady introduced the Archbishop, who began his talk with a few words about the chance that had enabled him to visit Rochester.

"The old world has passed," he said. "That chapter is closed, and the world will never again be the same. The young men who are coming on now will face problems and difficulties such as their fathers have never seen."

"We had hoped that the blood might not touch our shores, but now it has come and we are called to defend the inheritance of our fathers, even with our lives."
