War Brought Home.

Not so many of the present generation have any deep knowledge of or perception of the underlying causes of the Civil War. More's the pity. If we did we might not be so apathetic or callous about the present conflict and its possibilities.

A world of food for reflection is contained in this little news item which appeared a few days ago in a Rochester paper:

As virtually all of its members have answered to the call, the date of the 3d New York Cavalry's departure from Rochester will not be observed this year. All but four members of that body of brave men have answered to the summons of the world beyond.

Startling Figures. Startling figures have been presented by the Bureau of Census of the United States department of labor as to the increase in divorce in the last twenty years. From 1887 to 1906 there were 945,625 or nearly three times as many as in the twenty years previous.

This company appears to be admirably managed, in the interest of its stockholders. Its tonnage handled is not given; but whatever it was, its profits are as satisfactory as they would have been had it marketed three times as much coal at a profit of ten per cent.
