I. St. Peter, of Bethsaida in Galilee, Prince of the Apostles, who received from Jesus Christ the Supreme Pontifical Power to be transmitted to his Successors, resided first at Antioch, then at Rome, where he was martyred June 29, in the year 67, having governed the Church from that city for 25 years, 2 months and 7 days.

In the year 1262, St. Bonaventure, at that time General of the Franciscans, commanded his friars, at the general chapter of his order in Pisa, to promulgate the following devotion among the people.  
That at the sound of the evening bell, which in Rome and throughout Italy is rung half an hour after sunset, they should recite three "Ave Marias" in honor of the mystery of the Incarnation. The same was afterwards ordered also for morning and noon.  
This was the origin of the Angelus.
