Cardinal John M. Farley, D. D.

His Eminence John Cardinal Farley

Cardinal-Archbishop of the Archdiocese of New York presides over the largest See in population, and in the most important in influence and material property, of all the ecclesiastical divisions of the Catholic population census of 1909, being 1,219,920, of which 400,000 souls are Italians.

As auxiliary bishop, Rt. Rev. John Murphy Farley, was promoted to the archbishopric September 15, 1902, succeeding the late Archbishop Corrigan. He was made assistant at the Pontifical throne December 4, 1904, and created Cardinal Priest of the Holy Roman church, under the Title of Sancta Maria Supra Minervam, November 27, 1911.

Cardinal Farley was born in Newton, Hamilton County, Armagh, Ireland, April 20, 1842. His primary studies were made at St. McCarrian's College, Monaghan, and on coming to New York, were continued at St. John's College, Fordham. He also studied at St. Joseph's Provincial Seminary, Troy, N. Y., where many of the clergy of the diocese of Rochester received their ecclesiastical training. Later he went to Rome and entered the American College, where he was ordained priest June 11, 1870.

In 1872 he was appointed secretary to the then Archbishop McCloskey, and held that office until 1884, when he was appointed to the pastorate of St. Gabriel's Church, New York City. He was proclaimed Auxiliary Bishop of New York December 21, 1895.

As Archbishop Farley, he made rapid progress in Catholic education in his proceedings of the Catholic Educational Association held in New York in 1903, and the National Eucharistic Congress in 1904.

His brain sent forth the initial movement publishing the Catholic Encyclopedia, a work which has the stamp of approval of the most eminent Catholic church dignitaries extant.

IRISH MISSIONARIES IN ENGLAND

The Irish have been missionaries from choice and missionaries from necessity. They evangelized Europe in the earlier centuries. The two greatest missionaries in the Church since the days of the Apostles were Columbanus and Columbkille.

In his "Sequel to Catholic Emancipation," Monsignor Bernard Ward yields a chapter to the Irish influence in the Catholic revival in England. It was the famine which mainly sent the Irish over to England. Famed of the things of this world, the Irish were rich with sterling faith and zeal. They were the chief among the missionary forces of the Church in England.

In closing this chapter, Monsignor Ward writes: "They remained and still remain among us to give numbers and importance to our Catholic congregations, and their presence has contributed more than any other cause to the progress of Catholicism in this country."

His Eminence William Cardinal O'Connell

Presides over the Archdiocese of Boston which includes more than 900,000 Catholics.

His Eminence is also archbishop, the second to preside over the See of Boston.

William Henry O'Connell was born December 8, 1859, at Lowell, Massachusetts, and received his early education in the local schools and at St. Charles' College, Ellicott City, Maryland.

In 1881 he graduated at the Jesuit College in Boston and was sent to the American College at Rome to make his studies for the priesthood. He was ordained priest January 8, 1884, and returned to Boston in 1886. In 1895 he was appointed rector of the American College in Rome where he remained until his appointment to the bishopric of Portland, Me., being consecrated May 19, 1901. In the fall of 1905, the Pope sent him as special envoy to Japan in the interests of the church. He was decorated by the Mikado and warmly commended by Rome for his success.

After the death of Archbishop Williams he took possession of the See of Boston.

He was created a Cardinal at Rome, November 30, 1911, at the same time Farley received the "red hat."

Irish College at Rome

The Irish College had its inception when a private residence in Rome was occupied by Irish students January 1, 1628.

When the college was ordered to be closed in 1798 by Napoleon, the last student to leave, Dr. Blobe, was likewise the first to return 25 years later to arrange for its revival which dates February 18, 1826. The college is prosperous. Our late Holy Father Pius X. in 1909 presented a rich set of vestments to the college in memory of his jubilee. In the college church is buried the heart of Daniel O'Connell, the great Irish patriot, while all that is mortal of that illustrious man, rests in Glasnevin cemetery, Dublin, under an immense round tower.

THE POPE'S TIARAS

Among the most precious treasures of the Vatican are the gorgeous tiaras worn by the Pope on solemn occasions. Of these may be mentioned the one given by Napoleon to Pope Pius the Seventh, the diamond-encrusted one presented to Pius the Ninth by Queen Isabella of Spain, and the one given by Emperor William the First, of Germany, to Pope Leo XIII. On account of the weight of the gold and precious stones these tiaras are worn only on the most solemn occasions and then only for short intervals. Among the many rings in the possession of the Pope, the most valuable are the great ruby presented to Pope Leo XIII, by the late Sultan of Turkey, and the sapphire and diamond ring given to the same Pope by the Empress Dowager of China.
