

**LOUIS B. SAVARD**

**Widely Known Coal Merchant Dies After Lingering Illness.**

Louis B. Savard, 52, prominently known in business circles of this city, died Tuesday, Dec. 11th at his home, 104 Holbrooke street, after an illness of more than a year.

Mr. Savard had been connected with the L. C. Langie Coal Company for more than 35 years, and for the last twenty years was secretary of the company. Virtually all his business life was passed at the Triangle site, formerly the old Liberty Pole corner, at East avenue and Main street.

Born in Rochester, Mr. Savard was educated in the public and parochial schools and was a life-long member of Our Lady of Victory church in Pleasant street. He was a member of the Holy Name Society and a charter member of Branch 134, C. M. B. A., and was secretary of the branch since its organization. Mr. Savard had a wide circle of acquaintances and during his long business career made many warm friends.

He leaves his wife, Bertha; two daughters, Aurelia M. and Hortense P. Savard; one son, Basil Savard; one stepdaughter, Estelle M. Tettlebach; one stepson, Peter Tettlebach; four sisters, Mrs. M. J. Doucette, Harriet and Hortense Savard and Mrs. E. A. Leimgruber and one brother, Eugene Savard.

The funeral took place Friday morning at 8:30 o'clock from the house and at 9 o'clock from Our Lady of Victory church. Interment was made in Holy Sepulchre cemetery.

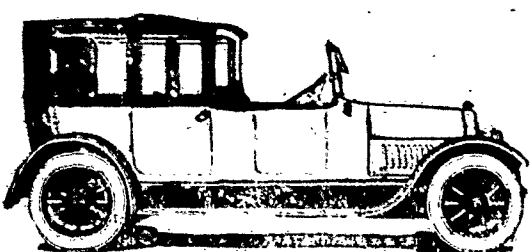
