ALCOHOLISM AND FRANCE.

It is commonly objected that wine drinking countries do not need abstinence, and that we ought to learn from them how to drink without injury.

France, the typical wine country, is the most alcoholized of all the countries, her consumption in terms of pure alcohol being 22 litres per capita, against 7.47 in Germany, and 6.89 in the United States ("Drink Consumption in Different Lands", Paris 1915.) In 1911 France had 196 deaths in every 100,000 population. Dr. Columbier says: "It is alcoholic poisoning that is responsible for the terrible evil of depopulation, rendering our men incapable of producing healthy offspring."

Every year more than 100,000 die of tuberculosis in France, and leading doctors like Professor Landouri, Dr. Letulle, Dr. Courmont and Dr. Baudrau say that alcoholism is the main cause of tuberculosis. Dr. LeGrain, the famous alienist, holds that 20,000 insane in France owe their malady to alcohol.
