SAVING OF WOOL AND COTTON

Conservation Important Because of Shortage and Mending Should Receive Careful Consideration.

Mending day assumes new importance and the mending bag takes on unwonted dignity now that war conditions prevail. Once it was perhaps our own affair whether or not we mended—conscientiously—as our neighbor. But now that there is a shortage of wool and no great abundance of other fabrics it amounts to a positive sin to throw away any garments so long as they may be mended into usefulness at any reasonable expenditure of time and energy, says an exchange.

If we feel that our own time is too valuable to spend on the mending then we should employ some one to do the task for us.
