St. Boniface.

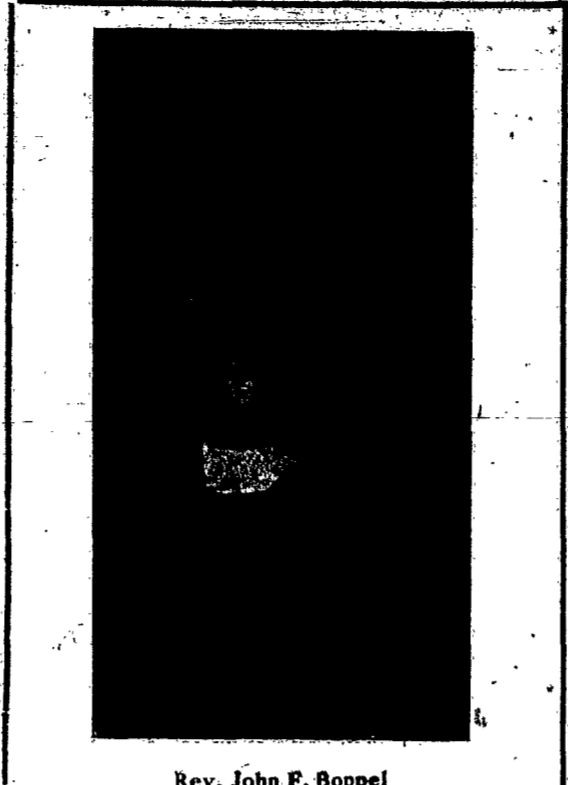
The masses on Sunday will be at 6, 7, 9 and 10:30 o'clock.

Pastor at St. Boniface Observes Anniversary--Gifts from People.

On last Tuesday, February 5th, an entertainment was given at our Parish hall in honor of the Silver Jubilee to the Holy Priesthood of our pastor, Rev. John F. Boppel. The hall was filled to its capacity and the St. Boniface Young Men's Club orchestra consisting of ten pieces, furnished music. The opening consisted of a "Jubilate Deo"--the children's chorus and greetings and made a pretty picture amidst a deluge of flowers and clever scenic effects. On the finale of this act a large "25" which was electrically lighted appeared in the midst of the merry group and made a clever and fitting effect for the occasion. A mixed voice chorus under the direction of Prof. Philip Kreckel was the next number which was followed by a "Hooverized" farce--a one act skit full of complexing and ludicrous situations and produced by the St. Boniface Footlight Club.
