**St. Peter and Paul.**

Its treasury is one of the largest of any society of its kind. The officers at present are: President, Joseph Weber; vice presidents, Frank Zuern, Joseph Werner; recording secretary, Frank C. Klueber; financial secretary, Albert F. Nagel; treasurer, John Strassner. The jubilee committee consists of Joseph Weber, chairman; Frank Zuern, A. F. Nagel, George Barker, Nicholas Werner, Joseph Werner and G. F. Schwarz.

The play will be given by a very capable cast, under the personal direction of Rev. Florian J. Reichert, C. S. S. R.

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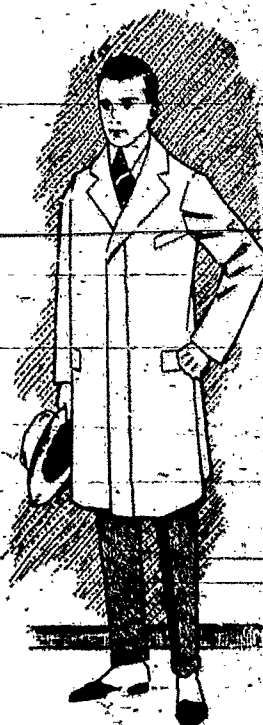
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
