

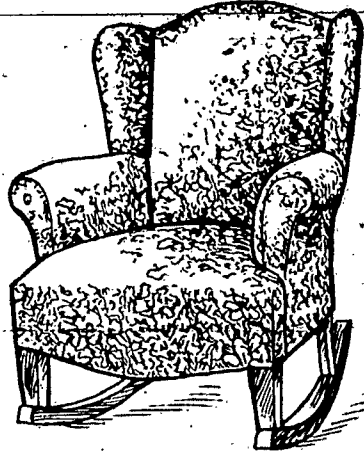

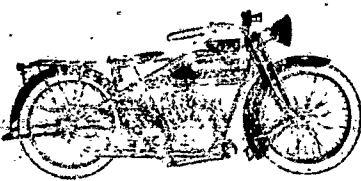

Interesting Budget of Happenings Gathered by Our City Reporter

Cathedral.

The closing of the mission will take place on Palm Sunday. General Communion at the 7:30 mass. In the evening there will be a sermon, renewal of baptismal vows, papal blessing, blessing of religious articles and distribution of Palm.

The Holy Hour will be observed on Saturday evening, March 23d, from 7:30 to 8:30 o'clock.

Solemn services were held on Monday, March 18th, on which day the feast of St. Patrick was celebrated. A pontifical mass was celebrated at 10:30 by the Right Reverend Bishop assisted by the clergy of the Seminary and of the city and sung by the students of St. Bernard's Seminary, the boys and men's choir of the Cathedral and the children of the Cathedral school. Rev. Joseph S. Cameron, Ph. B., delivered the panegyric.

The school will close on Wednesday, March 27th at noon and will reopen on Wednesday, April 3rd.

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday during Holy Week masses will be held at 6:30, 7, 7:30 and 8 o'clock. Confessions and Stations of the Cross at 4 p.m. on Monday and Tuesday.

Holy Thursday, March 28th—Holy Communion will be distributed at 6, 6:30, 7, 7:30, 8 and 8:30 o'clock, but there will be no mass. Solemn Pontifical mass, with procession of the Blessed Sacrament and consecration of Holy Oils at 10 o'clock. Tenebrae at 4 p.m. Singing of Stabat Mater.

Good Friday, March 29th—mass of the pre-sanctified with uncovering and veneration of the cross and singing of the passion at 9 a.m. Stations of the Cross at 12:15. Tenebrae service at 4 p.m. Adoration of the Cross the entire evening.

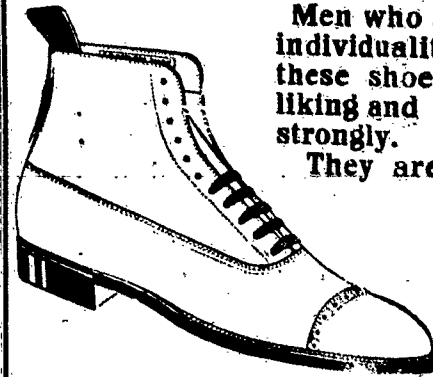
