Mother's Cook Book.

This was a good dinner enough to be sure, but it was not a dinner to ask a man to eat.

Economical Dishes. One ounce of meat for each person will be found sufficient when combined with other foods so that the flavor of the meat has seasoned the whole dish.

Meat With Rice. Line a casserole with boiled rice. In a saucepan mix a tablespoonful each of butter and flour, when well blended add salt and pepper, a cupful of rich milk and a half cupful or more of finely chopped meat.

Stuffed Peppers. Take two cupfuls of cooked meat and mix with a cupful of sausage, add salt and pepper and a half cupful of hot rice. Stuff the peppers with the mixture and bake.

Cheese Puff. Grease a pudding dish and lay into it slices of well buttered bread. Sprinkle each with a layer of rich cheese, finely cut or grated and pour over a pint of milk with two beaten eggs, salt and pepper. Bake until the custard is set.

Orange Cream. A thin custard poured over soft-boiled oranges, arranged in a sherbet cup, topped with a little cream and the white of an egg, makes a most delicious dessert.

William F. Moorehead, eighty years old, has been pardoned from the Missouri penitentiary by acting Governor Crossley. He is the oldest man who ever served in the prison.

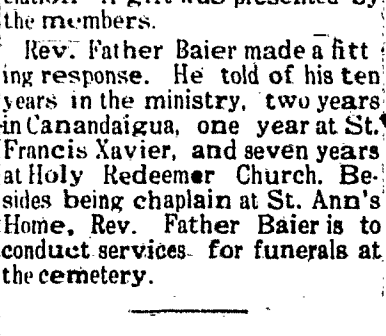
REV. JOHN B. BAIER TRANSFERRED.
