City Parish News

Interesting Budget of Happenings Gathered by Our City Reporter

Cathedral.

Holy Saturday, March 30th, there will be blessing of the new fire of the Paschal candle, of baptismal and Holy Water.

Distribution of Easter water in office of vestry at 2 p. m.

Easter Sunday, March 31st, masses will be at 6, 7:30, 8:30, 9:30 and solemn pontifical high mass with the imparting of the Papal blessing at the close by the Rt. Rev. Bishop at 10:30 a. m. Vespers and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 3:30 p. m.

Easter sermon at the high mass to be preached by Rev. Edward T. Meagher.

The offerings made on Good Friday at the mass and the adoration of the Cross, are devoted to the support of the shrines and sacred places in the Holy Land.

No masses of requiem, except a funeral mass are permitted during the first three week days of Holy Week. During the last three days of Holy Week not even a funeral mass is permitted, but the remains of the dead may be blessed before burial.

St. Boniface.

The masses on Sunday will be at 6, 7:30, 9 and 10:30 o'clock.

Our school closed on Wednesday morning during the Easter holidays and will again reopen the middle of next week.

On next Wednesday evening, the St. Herman's Benevolent Association will hold their regular monthly meeting.

The interior decoration of our church has now been completed, the new electric lighting system installed and the vast majority of the seats and other woodwork is now a scene of rare beauty and with the clever striping of ribs and joints the true gothic design and effect is clearly brought out. It has been in a measure a stupendous work due to the unusual height, there being between 38,000 and 40,000 feet board measure of lumber and stringers used alone for the scaffolding, and requiring several men during the past week in taking down the same. The ornamental paintings were designed and painted in the New York Studio of the contractor and are a splendid specimen of the artists brush and a credit to the Church.
