### TO REPEAT "JOAN OF ARC" FOR RED CROSS BENEFIT.

The Ladies' Auxiliary of St. Joseph's Church, assisted by the C. Y. M. A., will present the historical drama, "Joan of Arc" in St. Joseph's Hall, Franklin St., on Monday and Tuesday evenings, May 6 and 7th, for the benefit of the American Red Cross.

This play was given two weeks ago by a large, well drilled cast, the interpretation and rendition being enthusiastically received by capacity houses on the evenings of the performances. The demand for tickets at that time was greater than the seating capacity of St. Joseph's Hall, and on the last evening of the performance several hundreds of people were turned away.

Requests for a repetition of the play have been numerous, and as the time is most opportune for a drama which depicts scenes of a history making period, the cast, with the approval of Rev. Florian J. Reichert, rector of St. Joseph's Church, and the co-operation of Miss Josephine L. Hoffman, director of the play, has decided to repeat the production. The entire net proceeds will be contributed to the Rochester Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Tickets will be on sale on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons of next week at Gibbons and Stone's.

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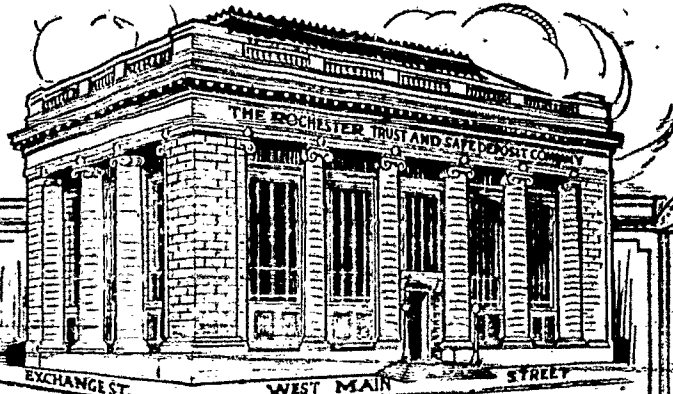
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
