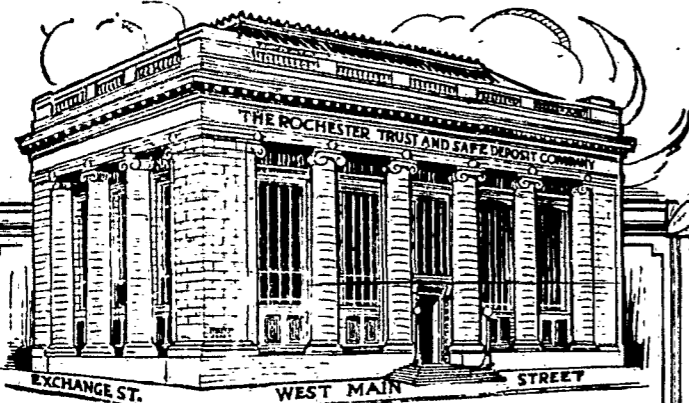

Interesting Budget of Happenings Gathered by Our City Reporter

St. Mary's Church.

After twenty years as diocesan consultant to Bishop Thomas P. Hickey, of Rochester Diocese, Rev. Simon FitzSimons, rector of St. Mary's Church, has resigned his diocesan office, the resignation to take effect at once. Father FitzSimons has been elected to the office seven times triennially.

In his letter of resignation, Father FitzSimons states that he presented the matter at this time as the priests of the diocese are now in annual retreat at St. Bernard's Seminary, and the selection of a successor will be easily accomplished. The resignation reads as follows:

"I hereby tender my resignation as Diocesan Consultant. In so doing I am not unmindful of the great kindness of the priests of the diocese who have been good enough to elect me to this responsible office seven consecutive times, triennially, covering a period of over 20 years. Neither do I fail to appreciate the uniform courtesy of the right reverend bishop and my colleagues during that long period.

"I am sending it at this juncture as the assembling of the priests for the diocesan retreat will facilitate the election of my successor.
