**Cathedral.**

Every evening during the month of October there will be held in the Lady Chapel the regular October devotions at 7:45, consisting of the Rosary, Litany of the Blessed Virgin, the prayer of St. Joseph and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

On Saturday, Oct. 5th, occurs the feast of the anniversary of the dedication and consecration of the Cathedral.

The contract for the Cathedral was let by the trustees in May, 1864, this being the 3rd stone church on the same site. On the 17th of March, 1869, work on the church was so far advanced that the congregation moved into it. C. S. R., as deacon, and Rev. John Thies, C. S. R., as sub-deacon. Delegations were present from the Sacred Heart Society, Altar Society, Holy Family, Perpetual Help and St. Joseph's Orphan Aid. The bearers were: Dr. John Bennett, Thomas Christy, John Bradley, Alphonse Sander, Charles Eaton and Eugene Savard. Music for the mass was sung by the male quartette of St. Joseph's Church. Charles J. Stupp was at the organ. Interment was made in the family lot in Holy Sepulcher cemetery. Rev. Father Liebert officiated at the grave.
