City Parish News

Interesting Budget of Happenings Gathered by Our City Reporter

Cathedral.
On Sunday, December 1st, the Forty Hours Devotion will begin at this church. The students of St. Bernard's Seminary will sing at the high mass to be held at 10:30 a.m.

Thomas J. Devine, president of the Board of Directors of the Burke, FitzSimons Hone Company, died at his home, No. 19 Portsmouth terrace, last Friday afternoon. He is survived by his wife, Helen Gaffney-Devine, one son, Captain Adrian G. Devine, now in France; two daughters, Miss Adelaide and Miss Louise Devine, and one brother, Francis B. Devine, of Riverside, Cal. The funeral took place on Monday morning at 10:30 o'clock from this church. Interment was made in Holy Sepulcher cemetery.

A pontifical month's mind mass for the Rev. Mortimer L. Nolan, who died during the influenza epidemic was sung at 9:30 o'clock Monday morning in this church. Assisting the Rt. Rev. Thomas F. At the conclusion of the mass Bishop Hickey spoke a few words in eulogy of Father Nolan. Thanksgiving day a solemn high pontifical mass was celebrated by Rt. Rev. Bishop Thomas F. Hickey. The mass was one of thanksgiving and peace and a special musical service was prepared by Professor Eugene Bonn. Rev. John Cavanaugh, C. S. C., president of Notre Dame University preached an eloquent sermon.

Father Hurley Becomes Pastor of Churches at Henrietta and Mendon

The Rev. Thomas F. Connors, who organized the congregation of the Church of the Good Shepherd in Henrietta and who has been acting as pastor since the church was opened, preached his farewell sermon to the parishioners last Sunday morning and announced to them the appointment by Bishop Hickey of the Rev. Victor Hurley as his successor.

Father Hurley, after his ordination, was stationed at the Cathedral and when the Rev. Dennis V. Lane was sent to Ithaca as assistant to the Rev. William Harrington, M. R., Father Hurley was sent to Blessed Sacrament Church as assistant to Father Connors and has been there since. As pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd in Henrietta he also will have charge of the Catholic parish in Mendon.

Father Connors will now be enabled to devote his entire time to the work of Blessed Sacrament parish. It is understood that no appointment of a successor to Father Hurley at the Oxford street church will be made immediately.
