Automobile Show Will Open Monday.

Next Monday night at 8 o'clock the eleventh annual Rochester Automobile Show will open in Buildings 3, 4 and 5 at Exposition Park.

Although the show is slated to get underway at 8 o'clock, the doors will be opened considerably earlier to let in the crowd which is expected to throng the buildings, not only on the first night, but throughout the six days of the exposition.

As usual there will be exercises just before the show is declared open. Henry G. Strong and Chas. T. Chapin, who are in charge of these arrangements, have their plans well in hand.

At 7:30 o'clock the members of the show committee and the directors of the Automobile Club of Rochester will line up in Building 3 at the show office. Headed by Park Band, under direction of Theodore Dossenbach; they will parade through the buildings to the bandstand in Building 5, where the exercises will take place. President George W. Henner of the Rochester Auto Trades Association and President Fredrick R. Smith of the Automobile Club of Rochester will escort President of the Common Council William W. Hibbard, upon whose shoulders will rest the task of delivering the salutatory address and declaring the show open.

At the bandstand President Henner will introduce President Smith, who will speak. President Hibbard will then be introduced, and he will declare the show ready for business.
