

Knights of Columbus

The National Catholic War Council has appointed William J. Carey, an attorney, of this city, field secretary for Central and Western New York. One of the principal duties of Mr. Carey, who formerly was deputy commissioner of excise, will be to find work for returning men in service.

It is presumed that Mr. Carey will name secretaries who will have offices in Buffalo and Syracuse. Mr. Carey will co-operate with the United States Employment Service and the Knights of Columbus in his work.

The Rev. J. E. Wood of Niagara University spoke on "Loyalty to Country and Church" at the Lincoln memorial exercises conducted by Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, in its rooms on Wednesday evening. James C. 'till the

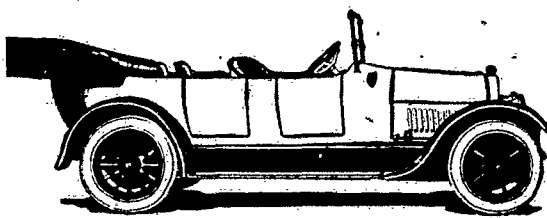
Storms fury has passed.

Included you will be.

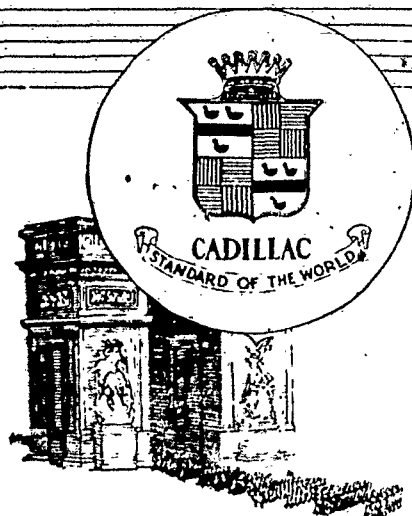
