Elman Revealed Musical Gifts When 3 Years Old

Mischa Elman, who is to give his only recital in Rochester this season at Convention Hall on Tuesday evening, March 11 has had a brilliant career as a violin virtuoso. At the early age of 3 he displayed an instinctive talent for musical expression, and he was only 12 years old when he made his first public appearance and conquered the citadel of a critical audience under the most trying and unusual circumstances.

A. H. Abell has written for the Musical Courier of January 16th an account of young Elman's debut before an audience of press critics exclusively in Berlin after a narrow escape the night before from death by accidental asphyxiation. Nevertheless, as Mr. Abell writes: "He captivated his listeners from the very start with his masterly declaration of the beautiful introduction to the theme of the first movement of the Tschai-kowsky Concerto."

Immediately after, he won triumphs in Europe and finally came to America in 1903, when he appeared with the Russian Symphony Orchestra and achieved the same success accorded him on the other side of the Atlantic. His popularity here is a matter of history.

Rules for Lent.

The holy season of Lent begins this year on the fifth day of March.

The obligation of fasting and abstinence end at noon on Holy Saturday.

All the weekdays of Lent are days of fasting on one meal, with a moderate collation in the evening. The practice of taking a small piece of bread with a cup of tea, coffee, chocolate, or the like, in the morning is permitted. It is also permissible to invert the order of meals by taking the collation at noon, and the principal meal in the evening.

The use of flesh meat is allowed without restriction on Sundays, and once on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, except Ash Wednesday and Wednesday of Ember Week. Eggs, milk, butter and cheese are allowed at the principal meal and at the collation. Lard and drippings may be used in preparing food.

Flesh meat and fish may be taken at the same meal on days when the use of flesh meat is allowed.

The law of fasting binds from the completion of the 21st year to the completion of the 59th, but the law of abstinence is binding after a person becomes 7 years of age. The following are not bound by the obligation of fasting: The sick, nursing women, those who are obliged to do hard labor, and all who through weakness cannot fast without prejudice to their health.

By virtue of a special indulgent given March 15, 1895, by the Holy See to the bishops of the United States for 10 years, and renewed June 3, 1915, in favor of the working men of this country who find it difficult to observe the general law of abstinence, the use of flesh meat is granted on all days of the year both to them and to all the members of their family, except on all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week and the eve of Christmas; this is a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence, but not of fasting. (This extraordinary dispensation is given solely to the working classes, and does not extend to the liberal professions.) Those who avail themselves of this indulgent are counseled to perform some penitential work, as, for example, abstinence from spirituous drink.

We hereby exhort all who for any reason are excused or dispensed from fasting or abstinence that they should practise mortification in eating and drinking according to their ability. We exhort them to substitute for the fast or abstinence from which they are exempt or dispensed some pious works, such as abstinence from all intoxicating drinks in honor of the Sacred Thirst of our Lord, attendance at Lenten devotions and almsgiving to the poor.

Pastors and resident assistants have the power of dispensing from the general law of fast and abstinence combined, but only in individual cases of persons or families and for a just cause. This power may be used in favor of their own parishioners, even when outside the parish and in favor of transients within the parish limits.

In churches where there is a resident pastor there will be a sermon and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament on every Wednesday evening, and the devotion of the Stations of the Cross on Fridays.

Pastors in charge of two churches will give one sermon in each church during the week.

Prayer and the spirit of penance should accompany penitential works. Endeavor, therefore, to excite your parishioners to observe this holy season according to the intention of the church, and place every facility in their way for receiving the sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist.

By reason of a long and existing indulgent granted to the bishops of the United States the precept of Paschal Communion may be fulfilled on any days between the first Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday, inclusive.
