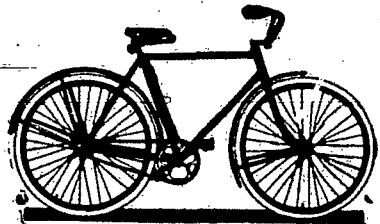

Cathedral.

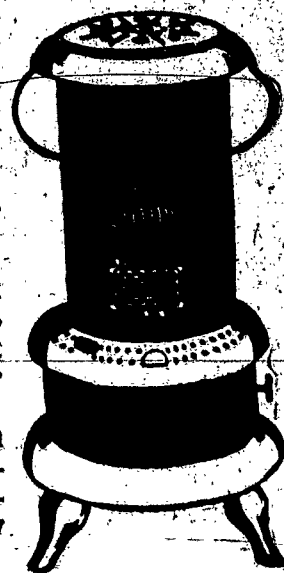
