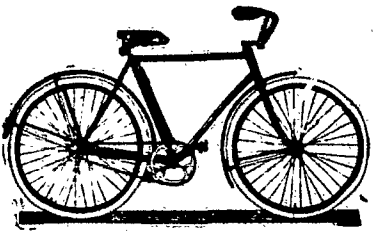

## Rev. John G. Baier Dies

Graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary, Ordained Priest in 1907.

The funeral of Rev. John B. Baier, late chaplain of St. Ann's Home, who died Thursday, May 22nd, took place Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock from Holy Family Church. The services were largely attended. About 100 priests from all parts of the diocese were in the sanctuary. Mass was sung by Right Rev. Thomas F. Hickey, D.D., assisted by Rev. D. Laurens, pastor of Holy Family Church.

The bearers were the Rev. Joseph Baier, the Rev. Dr. Edward Wirth and the Rev. Frederick Straub of St. Bernard's Seminary, the Rev. William W. Haisel, assistant pastor of the Holy Redeemer Church; the Rev. J. Edward Baier, assistant pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church, and the Rev. Sebastian Englert of Greece.

Interment was made in Holy Sepulcher Cemetery. The final absolution at the grave was administered by Bishop Hickey.

Father Baier leaves his mother, Mrs. Margaret Baier; a brother, Paul A. Baier, and three sisters, Barbara, Mary and Clara Baier. The body was taken to the home, No. 35 Lorenzo street, from where the funeral took place.

Father Baier was born on July 17, 1886, at Walden, Bavaria. He came to America at the age of 4 years. He was a graduate from the Holy Family School, from St. Andrew's and from St. Bernard's Seminary. He was ordained at St. Patrick's Cathedral on June 8, 1907.

## Memorial Mass Will Be Celebrated in The Cathedral Friday.

The memorial service at St. Patrick's Cathedral at 8 o'clock Friday morning May 30th, will consist of a solemn pontifical mass, to be celebrated by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey, assisted by the following officers: Assistant priest, Rev. D. J. Curran, V. G.; deacons of honor, Rev. A. M. O'Neill, M.R., and Rev. M. J. Hargather; deacon and subdeacon, Rev. Arthur A. The mass will be sung by the student choir of St. Bernard's Seminary, under the direction of Rev. John M. Petter, S.T.B., and the boys and men's choir of the Cathedral, under the direction of Eugene Bonn.

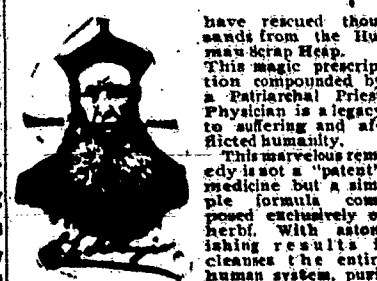
The card party which was to have been held Wednesday of this week by St. Joseph's Orphans' Aid Society is to be held on Wednesday, June 4th, instead.

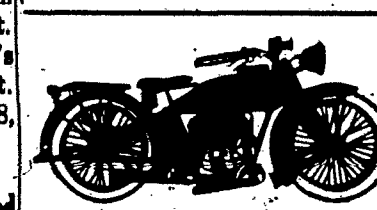
