St. Joseph's.

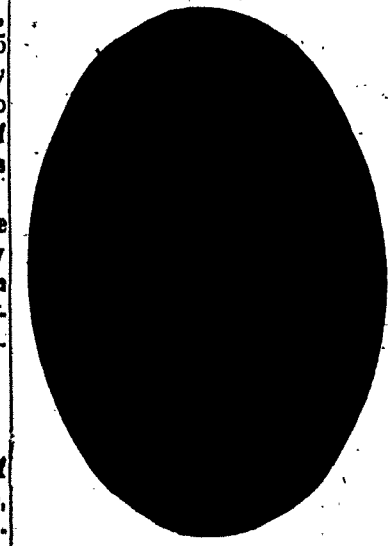
