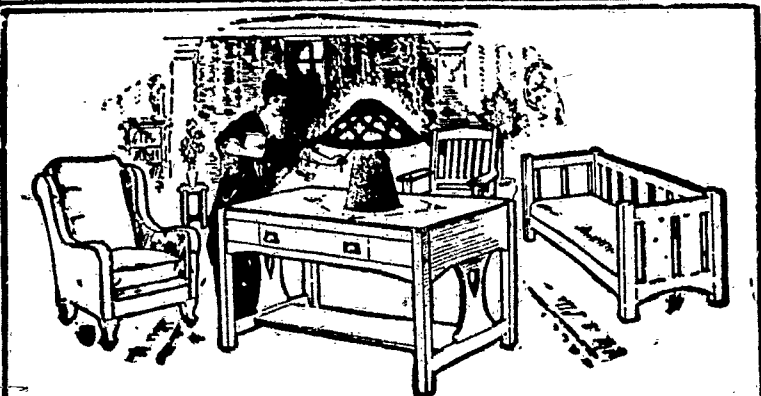

Thomas H. O'Neill, Dead

Auburn, Oct. 9. - Thomas Howard O'Neill, aged 67, twice mayor of Auburn and one of the foremost Republicans in Central New York, died at 9 o'clock Thursday night after several months illness.

Mr. O'Neill was one of the charter members of Auburn Council, Knights of Columbus, and was its second grand knight and the second faithful navigator of the Fourth Degree Assembly. He was the founder of the Catholic Relief and Beneficiary Association in the United States and was the national president for many years.

He leaves his widow; two sons, Michael H. O'Neill, of Detroit, Mich., and Thomas H. O'Neill, Jr. of this city; three daughters, Mrs. F. J. Mosher, of New York, Mrs. William Poyle, of Rome, and Miss M. Alice O'Neill, a student at Cornell University, and one brother, Rev. Augustine M. O'Neill, pastor of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Rochester. The funeral will be held from St. Mary's Church on Monday morning with burial in St. Joseph's cemetery.
